The Bill of Rights is not an ordinary bill. You don't have to pay it, like a bill in a restaurant. It is a bill that you get to keep; and that's a good thing because it gives citizens many protections and guarantees of freedoms. When the Constitution of the United States was written, the people of the new country insisted that a statement of these rights be added.




